Keeping the End in Mind: Using Progress Reports to Drive Goal Development

Stephen R. Covey coined the phrase “Begin with the end in Mind”. In the process of developing an IEP, it is easy to lose sight of the end goal: Improving the ability of a child to learn. Join Roxanne Bradley, Certified Special Education Advocate, and Barb Taylor, Director of Special Education, as they explore how using the progress report can drive the development of the goal. They will direct us as we learn:

- What information needs to be captured about a certain skill/ability
- How student performance should be communicated so the IEP team finds value in the report
- When data should be captured
- How to use the information gathered to develop an IEP goal

From this presentation, **parents** of children on IEPs, independent of the disability, will learn how to work with the IEP team to understand how your child is progressing.

From this presentation, **teachers/service providers** will learn how to determine whether the students are on track, a goal needs to be modified, and/or the interventions being used need to be changed.



Roxanne Bradley, certified special education advocate, is the President and Founder of Learning Differences World. Her passion is supporting families as she works with the parents to ensure their child's educational needs are met.
